



"High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza: Not just for the birds anymore!"

As we move back into spring and the weather warms, High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza cases are expected to be on the rise. The intent of this presentation is to provide an overview of the virus, address its current state in the wildlife of our province, and provide actionable recommendations for GP veterinary teams. Topics covered will include how to advise the public with questions about sick wildlife, what to do if someone presents a sick bird to your clinic, and what we know about clinical infections in cats so far. The goal is for an informal but informative discussion.
